

All Digestive Cancers



Act4Biosimilars is a global initiative that aims to increase patient access to biologics by facilitating greater Approvability, Accessibility, Acceptability and Affordability (the 4As) of biosimilars.

Earlier this year, the Act4Biosimilars initiative launched the Act4Biosimilars Action Plan alongside the first in a series of Deep Dive Reports focused on the Americas, which brings into focus the challenges hindering biosimilar adoption across the region. Most recently, the second Deep Dive Report, which puts a spotlight on biosimilar uptake in Europe, was launched on 16 November 2023. <u>Read more</u>.
